

Dear Lighthouse Families,

Last month we launched Nantucket Lighthouse School's Annual Appeal. We are off to an excellent start and are so heartened by the generous response from our community. While a majority of the gifts are typically received by December 31, the Appeal extends through the school year, specifically through June 30. We are eager to reach 100% parent participation with this year's Annual Appeal, and with your help, I am certain we will get there.

As I shared back in September, the Annual Appeal is the school's single largest and most important fundraiser. It accounts for approximately half of our annual fundraising, and it is the method by which we maintain our strong programs and keep our tuition accessible. Happy, Thoughtful Kids Grown Here

Recent research continues to affirm what guides so much of our work at Nantucket Lighthouse School: the need to protect childhood—now more than ever.

A major new study published in the *Journal of Human Development and Capabilities* examined more than 27,000 young adults worldwide, ages 18–24. Researchers found that those who received their first smartphone at age 12 or

younger were significantly more likely to report poorer mental health outcomes later in life (particularly higher rates of suicidal thoughts, feelings of isolation or detachment from reality, aggression, and lower self-worth) compared with peers who received their first phone at age 13 or older.

While the study does not prove that smartphone use directly causes these challenges, it strongly suggests that early exposure to social media, online comparison, cyberbullying, and disrupted sleep may play a major role. The authors recommend delaying smartphone ownership and promoting digital literacy and boundaries as key protective factors for developing minds.

Last week, a parent from California reached out after discovering our school's philosophy. She shared how, in her child's kindergarten class, social media influence is already shaping friendships and play. She longs for a community of parents who share her instinct to slow down. Her story was a powerful reminder of how rare and precious Nantucket Lighthouse School truly is.

Together, we are ensuring that children are given the space to build forts instead of followers, to explore nature instead of navigating online trends, and to form relationships face-to-face rather than through screens. These are not small things; they are the foundation of emotional health and resilience. When we, as parents and educators, choose to delay devices, model mindful technology use, and promote real-world connections, we are not just protecting our own children- we are engaging in a collective act of care.

They arrive early to give extra assistance to middle school math students so they may earn an A on a test, they are endlessly devoted to professional development so they may continue to support our children on the road to literacy, and they wake up early in the morning thinking about new ways they can offer scaffolding to students who may have challenges with focus.


