Happy, Thoughtful Kids Grown Here

This past Wednesday's parent-teacher conferences were such a wonderful

opportunity to connect. As I sat in on several conversations, I was reminded what a true privilege it is to know and support your children alongside you. Each discussion reflected your deep care, thoughtfulness, and intention. It is an honor to partner with you in the shared work of raising your children.

With that deep care often comes something familiar to us all—worry. As parents, we naturally wonder whether we're doing enough—making the right choices about routines, after-school activities, food, and screen time (to name a few). A constant stream of comparison and advice can make it easy to lose sight of all the ways we are already showing up for our kids.

I remember feeling that worry years ago while in graduate school to become a counselor. With two toddlers at home, I missed more than a few bedtimes and often felt the ache of guilt that I wasn't doing it all. Then, in my studies, I came across a concept that shifted my perspective: the **Good Enough Parent**.

Coined by pediatrician and psychoanalyst Donald Winnicott, this theory suggests that perfection in parenting isn't just impossible—it's unnecessary. Winnicott found that when parents inevitably fall short in expected, everyday ways, children actually benefit. They learn to tolerate frustration, adapt to disappointment, and develop resilience. What matters most is not that we never make mistakes, but that we remain present and willing to repair.

Parenting asks a lot of us, but perfection isn't one of those things. Our children don't need flawless parents—they need real ones. The love you have for your children is undeniable. Meeting their needs most of the time is more than enough for them to thrive.







